## **FAQs – About – Scholarships**

### How can I get a William G. Coyne Credit Union ONE Scholarship Program application?

You may request an application by downloading it online or by contacting 800-451-4292 and asking for the Scholarship Line.

### What are the Scholarship Program eligibility requirements?

To be eligible, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Complete 30 or more hours of documented, qualified community service work between January 1, 2010, and February 15, 2011
- Be a 2011 graduating high school senior
- Be a member of Credit Union ONE for a minimum of six months
- Have a cumulative high school grade point average of 3.0 or above
- Plan to enroll in, beginning in the fall of 2011, a full-time undergraduate course of study at an accredited two-or four-year college or university, or accredited trade or vocational school

Employees of Credit Union ONE and their immediate family members are ineligible to receive a Scholarship.

### What documentation do I need to turn in with my form?

Please download the application for a complete list of required documentation.

### What is the Scholarship Program application deadline?

All documentation must be packaged and postmarked by February 15, 2011. Late and incomplete submissions will not be reviewed. Credit Union ONE is not responsible for lost or misplaced items.

### What types of community service work qualify?

Credit Union ONE defines community service as those activities that benefit the public good. These activities can be done in partnership with a local nonprofit,

community-based and/or governmental organization with the intention to enrich the lives of community members. Any public volunteer work for charitable service agencies that benefits the student's local community in Michigan will qualify. Work from multiple community service ventures can be combined to achieve 30 hours or more.

For more information about volunteer opportunities, contact your local high school counseling center. Let them know you are interested in volunteering to earn a William G. Coyne Credit Union ONE Scholarship.

#### How are William G. Coyne Credit Union ONE Scholarships given?

The completed applications of eligible applicants will be evaluated by the William G. Coyne Credit Union ONE Scholarship Program Committee. Selected recipients will be awarded one of the following: one \$2,000 Scholarship or one of three \$1,000 Scholarships. If selected as a recipient, the student will be expected to authorize release of information regarding community service activities, essays, and a parental consent form to utilize images and photos of recipients in media and marketing materials for publicity purposes.

Recipients are required to supply the William G. Coyne Credit Union ONE Scholarship Program Committee with complete transcripts and to notify the Committee of any change of address and school enrollment. Credit Union ONE reserves the right to make changes at any time regarding the scholarship program.
